LOVE affair with Harley Davidson motorcycles has thrust delicatessen owner Alan Parker into the forefront of planning for a multiclub motorcycle concourse being held as part of Graceville Primary School's fete on September 13.

Mr Parker has been a motorcyclist for about 40 years, and has owned nine or 10 Harley Davidsons.

His Harley Davidson Tour Glide Ultra Classic, bought in the US in September 1991, is an eyestopper. Weighing 345kg, it is valued at about \$23,000.

"You don't need to prove anything on a Harley Davidson. It's a wonderful experience," he said.

Mr Parker is a member of the world-wide Harley Davidson Owners Group, a 120,000-strong organisation.

The United States Consul has provided a trophy for the best-presented Harley Davidson at the

Graceville school fete.

Among personalties appearing at the fete are including Brisbane's First Lady of Jazz, Leah Cotterell, internationally-acclaimed pianist and composer Jeff Usher, Rock'n'Roll Circus, the Mallee Scrub Band and members of the Early Music Society.

All have donated their time and performances to the cause, resulting in the fete being named "Sounds Like Graceville".
